These are some of the more practical options we thought would be helpful and achievable!

Stop the cut backs to Sure Start Centres:

Surestart Centres provide a wide range of important services for families, tailored to each areas specific need.

[A report by 4Children](#) has shown that at least 250 essential Sure Start Centres will close.

Scrap the welfare benefit cap of £500 a week:

The Welfare Benefit Cap will be in place in January 2013. This will cap the amount of entitled support to £500 a week, with few exceptions, regardless of the number of children in the family.

Ring-fence funding for family intervention projects:

Originally David Cameron promised to ring-fence the funding for Family Intervention Projects – we'd like him to bring back that promise!

We would like the money devolved to Local Authorities to be protected and used to help young children and families to prevent future anti-social behaviour.

Bring back Surestart maternity grant for second child:

We want David Cameron to bring back the Sure Start maternity grant for second child.

Our ['Born Broke'](#) report found that the period around the birth of a baby can be a difficult time financially, since in many cases, the additional costs is combined with parents being off work on leave.

In many cases, financial worries may compound existing problems of depression for parents.
