Workshops for Lincolnshire schools: 2017–18

There are many potential reasons for pupils to display behaviour that is challenging – signs of abuse, anger or distress, mental health, poor environment, inconsistent routines to name but a few.

Lincolnshire BOSS is able to offer workshops during 2017–18 to support schools to address issues that may be contributing to pupils displaying behaviour that challenges.

Mental Health First Aid (Youth)

This two-day accredited workshop looks at how to identify, understand and help a young person who may be developing a mental health issue.

Adolescent Mental Health

This training helps school staff to develop an understanding of the mental health needs of teenagers, and how to enable young people to get appropriate help and support to overcome these difficulties.

Strengthening Wellbeing and Professional Resilience

This session helps staff to enhance their wellbeing and professional resilience.

Autistic Spectrum Disorder and ADHD Awareness

This workshop helps professionals to understand the impact of these disorders on children, and strategies to help children in school settings.

Attachment in the Classroom

This training aims to enable school staff and volunteers to assist children who have experienced trauma and attachment difficulties to get the best out of their learning environment through strategies and practical tools for school settings.

Attachment, Bereavement, Separation and Loss

Many children have experienced separation, trauma and loss, which can negatively impact on their functioning and ability to learn. This workshop looks at key principles of attachment and how to help children through the grief cycle.

Pathological Demand Avoidance (PDA) Awareness

This briefing looks at what PDA is, the anxiety that drives children to need to feel 'in control', and some strategies to manage the resulting behaviour.
