New programme launched to support children and families during school holidays

School holidays can be challenging for vulnerable and low-income families. The loss of free school meals and regular social and play opportunities can create stress and worry, leading to social isolation and put nutrition, wellbeing and finances under additional strain. We are delighted to announce the launch of a new programme, Families, Food and Fun (FFF), which will help to address these issues.

Families, Food and Fun will be co-ordinated by Family Action, with additional support being provided by Magic Breakfast and the Brakes founded Meals & More programme. Funded by the Department for Education (DfE), the programme will offer children AND their parents/carers free healthy food. Alongside this, a range of enrichment activities, including food preparation, growing food, cooking, budgeting, music, drama, crafts, and physical activity will be on offer. There will also be educational trips in the local community and signposting to local support services. Schools, community settings and charities in targeted disadvantaged areas of England have been encouraged to apply to receive support to deliver Families, Food and Fun during the summer 2018 holidays.

Settings accepted on to the programme will receive a grant to pay for essential items, such as food, activity resources, venue hire and additional staffing. A wide range of support will be provided from dedicated staff within Family Action, such as briefings and training, observations, building links with other organisations, and planning to sustain provision after the Summer 2018 holidays.

Children and Families Minister Nadhim Zahawi said:

"For most pupils, the end of the school summer term signals the start of holidays, days out and a chance to make memories with friends and family. Other families, who might rely on the support provided by schools, are not so lucky.

"I'd like to congratulate Family Action who will run Families, Food and Fun this summer to support the most disadvantaged families in various locations across England. This exciting scheme will open the door to exciting, engaging activities for young people, make sure they are getting a healthy meal and, above all, give them the summer holiday memories and experiences they all deserve."

David Holmes CBE, Chief Executive of Family Action, said:

"This is a great opportunity to reduce holiday hunger and make the summer holidays more fun for children and families in more areas where there is significant need. Families, Food and Fun will give children and families access to healthy food, fun and engaging activities to make the long summer holiday easier and to aid children's long-term development and learning. Parents and carers will also have the opportunity to gain additional knowledge and skills in a friendly and supportive environment. We are going to make this a summer to remember for lots of children and families."



Carmel McConnell MBE, Founder of Magic Breakfast, said:

'I know of children who dread the approach of the school holidays because they know they won't get enough to eat, nor the opportunity to get out and take part in fun, safe, activities. Families, Food and Fun will take this very real stress away for so many families this summer and help to ensure that hundreds of children will return to school in September well-nourished, happy and ready to learn.'

"We're delighted to see the launch of the Families, Food and Fun programme and are thrilled to be able to increase the support available in some of the most deprived areas of need, helping more families, children and communities. Notes to Editors:

Up to an estimated three million children risk being hungry in the school holidays. This group comprises over a million children growing up in poverty who receive free school meals during term time, as well as an estimated two million who are disqualified from free school meals because their parents work for their poverty.
