“Each cohort of excluded pupils goes on to cost the public purse an additional 2.1 billion in benefits healthcare, and criminal justice costs. Less than 1 in 200 children is permanently excluded from school, but in the prison population almost 1 in 2 were excluded as children” Institute for Public Policy Research (2017)

Family Action and PAC-UK Education Service is founded on trauma informed, solution focussed and restorative principles. Benefits of Our Service:

Children:

- Make strides towards independent learning
- Increased mental and emotional wellbeing
- Happier in education
- Better able to learn

Education Provision:

- Reduction in fixed term and permanent exclusions
- Increased staff confidence in managing a range of difficult behaviours
- Increased staff wellbeing, therefore reducing staff absence
- Reduction in time spent on managing behaviour
- Fewer incidents of classroom disruption
- Improved learning environments

Staff sickness has reduced




Young people are less disruptive
