They will have experience of delivering a range of workshops and short-term interventions to local families to facilitate parents' understanding and awareness of their children's emotional, social and physical needs, providing support in families homes, across local Family Hubs, maternity hubs and other delivery sites.

You will have a Level 3 Qualification in childcare/child development, health & social care, counselling or other related professional qualification and at least two years' experience of working with children, young people and their families including delivery of group work.

You will have good assessment skills, with the ability to produce effective outcome focused plans and ability to evidence impact and outcomes from 1:1 and group work.

You will have knowledge and understanding of integrated working practices and the range of services and agencies to involve.

You will have experience of partnership working that have resulted in successful outcomes for families.

You will have experience of working as part of a multi-disciplinary team and information sharing protocols with a commitment to reflective practice and effective supervision.

You will have demonstrable knowledge and understanding of set Child Protection procedures and working together to Safeguard Children with ability to work in accordance with organisational Child Protection and Adult Safeguarding procedures.

The post will involve working across the Barrow locality and occasional travel across Cumbria. Therefore, a UK Driving License or the means to travel around the locality daily is essential.
