

Family Action and Barclays Launch 3-Year Partnership

Family Action and Barclays announce a 3-year partnership to support families and individuals across the country.

Through the delivery of Barclays LifeSkills workshops and the provision of Learning Support Grants, the partnership is helping people to meet basic household needs and build their confidence, whilst developing the practical employability, digital and financial skills needed to access jobs now and in the future.

Barclays LifeSkills workshops are being delivered through Family Action's services and their partner organisations across England. The workshops provide resources and support, working towards strengthening families, by raising parents and carers' confidence and helping them advance their employment prospects, and or, careers.

The Learning Support Grants, worth up to £1000 for each recipient, will provide financial support to parents and carers UK-wide who want to begin or continue in education or training, and to increase their employability prospects. Eligible recipients are parents or carers from participating colleges, and/or those who take part in Barclays LifeSkills through Family Action services.

Parent and political refugee, Zara* attended LifeSkills workshops in Southend and is the first recipient of the Learning Support Grant. Zara said: "I attended LifeSkills to improve my English and complete several courses to help improve my confidence. I was very shy at the time, and I hesitated to speak English, as I was worried about saying the wrong words. I thought people would laugh, but the LifeSkills staff understood what I was saying and what I wanted to say.

"When I asked them for support with something they always tried to find different ways to help me. For example, they helped me get funding to register for GCSE English and accounting courses and to pay for my exams and travel. When I can speak better English and finish my accounting course, I hope I can maybe work again."

Kirstie Mackey OBE, Head of Barclays LifeSkills, said: "This year marks our 10th anniversary of Barclays LifeSkills, and the launch of our new strategy to address social inequalities. As we look to the future, we are delighted to continue our partnership with Family Action to support families to thrive.
